Dear Church Family,

Maybe it means slowing down to a pace which enables us to really notice those things that take our breath away. Maybe it is about looking for the way God is at work in our life and world each day.

I pray that you may be blessed over the next few months. That you may experience rest and be refueled. Take time to reconnect with your joy and your loved ones. Give yourself time to breathe deeply and celebrate the gift of life. And as we join together in worship each Sunday, grow closer to God and stronger in our faith.

May this Summer Sabbath be a time of abundant blessings for you and yours!

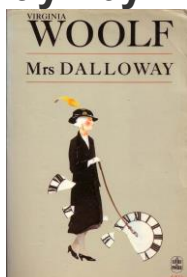
Book Club

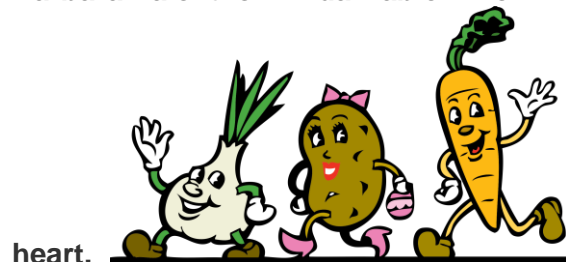

Recycling is a complicated thing! Please take a moment to get some of the details by reading the below. If you have any questions, contact Janie Schildge or Barb Valenti (barb.mellenti@gmail.com)

We have removed the 5-gallon buckets that were under the church mail sorting station, so please don't just leave previously collected items there because....

BATTERIES: There are two kinds of batteries, the household, non-rechargeable type (AAA, AA, C, D) and the rechargeable kind (used for lawn and power equipment). The Middletown Recycling Center no longer collects the household batteries, they say they are safe to throw in the trash (so do so). We do not have any one to take the rechargeable batteries to Lowes or Home Depot (we welcome any volunteer) so we ask that YOU take them to Lowes or Home Depot for recycling. The place to deposit them is just as you enter the store.

CFC/FLUORESCENT BULBS: The church is eliminating use of these bulbs and is going to LED. It is rare that the ones the church generates get taken to the County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility ([3211 Shafto Road, Tinton Falls](#), 732-683-8686) so we ask YOU to please dispose of them there yourselves (or, once again, we welcome a volunteer to assume this duty for the church).

BOTTLE CAPS: We still collect them but they go into the black trash can under the secretary's glass window as you enter church (called the "Recycling Center"). **PLEASE, not all caps are collectable. We must pay Terracycle to take them and they only accept (under our program), BOTTLE caps, NOT jar lids, jug caps, laundry detergent caps, shaving cream caps, etc. BOTTLE caps are usually about 1 inch in diameter and come off water, gatorade, and other drinks. We**

have to sort and remove (and throw out) all the other caps you throw in this container). Once again, we'd love to have a volunteer do this sorting for us.

CEREAL LINERS and FOIL-LINED ENERGY BAR WRAPPERS: We collect these (and get a nominal return). See the black lidded trash cans in the back entry way (labeled "Recycling Center"). More on this in future OUTLOOKS,

We do **NOT** collect white styrofoam (from non-food source) but we would love to **if** we had a volunteer to drive it to the facility in [Springfield NJ \(72 Fadem Rd\)](#).

We really are trying to do our best to take care of Mother Earth and appreciate all your efforts it is just that we don't have enough volunteers to dispose of the items we collect, so please help us out! A volunteer would only need to properly dispose of recycle material once every month or so.

RED BANK CROP HUNGER WALK #38 goes on Sunday, October 21st from Red Bank Regional High School through three towns to raise funds and food for 15 local pantries helping to end hunger in Monmouth County, and also to help global partners to improve their lives through sustainable agriculture, basic health and hygiene, and clean water. **SAVE THE DATE** as Red Bank United Methodist Church is a water stop sponsor and the half way spot on this five mile walk. Look for more information as we go through the next few months as to how you can help.
