### *“The Natural World”*

***“The earth is defiled by its people” Isaiah 24:5 (a)***

**Lesson:** In Genesis 1:26-28, God gives humans “dominion” over the earth and everything in it. Associated with kingship, the Hebrew word for dominion, “radah” has long been misconstrued to mean “domination,” and so used to erroneously defend the harsh ecological destruction and cruel injustices that are byproducts of the consumerism, greed and selfish overconsumption especially inherent in industrialized nations. Like ancient Israel’s Kings, however, we are instead called to ethically serve as God’s viceroys or stewards, protecting, preserving and restoring God’s creation to the harmonious goodness God intended in the beginning, while also using the same compassionate care and fair treatment as the Divine Creator, which includes an eye on the oppressed, for all of God’s suffering creation.

Good stewardship takes a caring heart. The first step begins with knowledge. Through familiarity we learn to love, which in turn sparks our desire to nurture and protect.

So this week, try introducing your family to God’s wild kingdom by taking a virtual trip...or two...to the San Diego zoo which offers a host of live web cams free, from apes to polar bears and everyone in between!

Daily “check-ins” can help deepen the relationship and encourage your young steward to dig deeper into the challenges these species face, while also working towards solutions that can help bring hope to God’s majestic creatures.
