Dear Church Family,

As we approach Pentecost, the day we remember the work of the Holy Spirit in the church since its inception, our Confirmands are preparing for their big day, when they have the opportunity to declare their desire to join in the membership of the UMC of Red Bank. Elaine Dawson has been doing a wonderful job teaching our confirmation class this year, infusing her passion for Christ and the church into each lesson and inspiring excitement and thoughtful reflection in our youth. As she has been journeying with them this year, I have been reflecting on what Confirmation means, not just for the youth who will be professing their faith on Sunday, May 20th, but for our whole church.

The life of faith is like a pilgrimage or journey, on which there are many challenges and opportunities. The Christian life is a dynamic process of change and growth that we mark at various points by ritual celebrations of God's grace working in our lives. Occasionally throughout year, we are privileged to witness and participate in the sacrament of Baptism; the ritual that incorporates individuals as members of Christ's church and recognizes the work of the Holy Spirit in their lives. On Pentecost, our church family will have the opportunity to celebrate another important ritual as eight of our youth present themselves for Confirmation. After a year of preparation and exploring their faith, these Confirmands will be taking on the responsibility for living as a member of the body of Christ and for fulfilling God's purposes. It is a special time for experiencing divine grace and for consciously embracing one's Christian vocation. I invite you to hold these individuals in your prayers as they take this important step of faith: Kaie-Ann Smalls, Lauren Tse, Ryan Bullivant, Emory Broek, Tamia Birch-Gentles, Molly Moore, Jack McCann and Charlie McCann.

While these Confirmations will take place during a single 10:00 am service on May 20th (following the Pancake Breakfast from 8-10 am), everyone at worship will have the opportunity to participate in the related ritual of Reaffirmation of our Christian faith – an invitation to "Remember your baptism, and be thankful." Whether we were baptized as infants or children, teenagers or adults, it is good to take time to remember this important sacrament. As baptized Christians, such remembering calls us anew to share the Gospel, by word and deed, with the world around us. It encourages us to join with the Confirmands in experiencing again God's divine grace poured into our lives as we consciously embrace our own Christian vocation. It challenges us to ask of ourselves: are we faithfully living into God's calling on our lives?

I look forward to this special service of worship on the 20th, and hope to see you there to support our confirmands on their big day! And for those who will be unable to be with us, for a myriad of reasons, I say to you now: Remember your baptism, and be thankful!

May Christ's resurrection hope be yours this day!







Our Red Bank UMC made the decision to be certified by Greenfaith.org back in 2009 and for three years we worked on audits and updating our property and envisioning our future as a green energy church. This included all areas of church life – Worship, Education, Property, energy usage, food, plastics, waste audits, Environmental justice issues, and more. It was a long and detailed process. Our Green Team led the project, under the leadership of Myrna Bethke, our pastor. In 2012 we were presented with our Green Faith Banner, and ever since we have worked to keep up with the pledges we made to be better stewards of our Earth. The Solar Panel Project involved Hudson Solar Partners who underwrote the installation of the panels, under George Schildge, and Property, under John Walradt, with better insulation, new windows, removal of old fuel tanks, and much more. The Trustees (Susan Drury, head) worked on the landscaping with no pesticides, and new plantings, and the removal of the old wall in front. We do have the most beautiful church property in Red Bank at this time. We were the first United Methodist Church to enter Greenfaith and we shared our experience at conference and district meetings to help other churches begin to go green.

This year's Fair was for us to recommit to our goals: Our pledge is: I Pledge to make my life a blessing for the Earth". Displays were up in the parlor and library and there were reusable bags, milkweed seed for Monarchs, information on non-toxic fertilizers and pesticides, and how to help the UMW garden this year. Five people won the raffle for a Pizza Garden Kit, and Pastor Jess donated her marvelous and delicious home canned goods for all to purchase, with proceeds going to the church budget. Solar tours were offered, and recycling bins were explained, as we have entered two Brigades for Recycling that can actually earn us money – One is for SOLO plastic cups, and the other is for ENERGY BAR Wrappers, so please start sorting these out and bring to church to put into the bins by the back entrance. Barb Valenti and I will ship them to Terracycle, and we need all you use. We will take bottle caps, just to prevent litter and injury to animals, and these are considered no waste efforts. You can find out how to recycle in your town with the Monmouth County Guide, available at church. We asked the children of the church, and their families and friends, to stop using plastic Bottles, Bags, and Straws. This trio of plastic is causing much injury and death to many species, and eventually we will reap what we sow, so please use alternatives, or don't use any. Our Theme is to Reduce, Refuse, Reuse, Recycle, Remove.

We can all take action on these issues, and postcards will be available with addresses for the EPA (Environmental Protection Agency), to not renew the license to sell ROUND UP, which kills monarchs and poisons the food supplies of many pollinators which we need to survive. You can also write to Monsanto's CEO about stopping the sale of Round Up. The Governor of NJ (to ban styrofoam) and there will be others, so stop by the table in back hall to take some positive action. Our Green Team will be happy to stamp and mail your postcard if you wish. You really can help make decisions on policy and

health, including water and air pollution, if you make your voice heard. We will set up a field trip to better understand single stream Recycling in Monmouth County if there is enough interest. Thank you to our Green Team Members – Janie Schildge, Kathy Kelley, Kathy Hackler, David Henritzy, John Walradt, Jack Way, Barbara Valenti, Bob Shindel, Jessica Naulty, Tiffany McCann, Ken Glossbrenner, Elaine Dawson, and friends Barbara Roguski, Cyndi Skove, Jim Mellon, Dillon McCann, Mia Voorhees, and Molly Foster.
