Who We Are

Ann Martin Center is an East Bay nonprofit organization founded in 1963 to support emotional health and school success for at-risk youth. We assist children and adolescents who face adversity including trauma, physical/sexual/emotional abuse, high-conflict divorce, learning disabilities, and academic failure.



Our Mission

Ann Martin Center is dedicated to improving the lives of at-risk children, youth and their families in Alameda County by providing psychotherapy, educational therapy, diagnostic assessment, and training. We promote healthy emotional development and effective learning skills. We nurture confidence, resilience, and the ability to make positive choices that strengthen caring relationships, independence and productivity. The Center is distinguished by its emphasis on both emotional and educational support.

The Youth We Help



Ann Martin Center is a community-based agency committed to providing exceptional quality services to families regardless of income. We primarily serve children and youth ages 3 to 21 with social-emotional and behavioral problems. Some examples of emotional challenges are sadness, anxiety, aggression, developmental problems (including autism spectrum disorders), and/or learning challenges (including dyslexia and attention deficit disorder). Annually, we assist around 1,000 children and families through 30,000 treatment hours at our clinic and thirteen Emeryville, Berkeley, and Oakland public schools. In an effort to increase our impact, we offer trainings to teachers, administrators, mental health professionals, and other community partners.

Our Programs

- **Psychotherapy** – Ann Martin Center provides mental health counseling and guidance to youth and families. Specialized programs include family bereavement counseling, socialization groups for children on the autism spectrum, and Educationally-Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS). These services are provided in our clinic, in the community, and in school settings.
- **Educational Therapy** – Our Learning Program provides individualized educational therapy that identifies learning disabilities or differences, and develops specific alternative strategies for learning.
- **Diagnostic Testing** – We offer comprehensive educational and psychological diagnostic testing.
- **Community Education Program (CEP)** – We provide workshops that strengthen parent-child-family relationships by addressing parenting concerns about their child's emotional, behavioral, and academic development. With an emphasis on prevention and early intervention, our workshops provide vital support, skills, and tools that promote positive parenting. We also sponsor free lectures for mental health professionals in the community.
