## **Observations**

- Economically, this is a crisis in consumer spending, not fundamentals
- Disproportionate impacts to low-income workers, vulnerable populations
- Recovery will be more a function of health indicators than of economic policy
- Economic policy & economic development practice remain essential to mitigate impacts & drive recovery

## Sources of Intel

#### National data

- Nearly half of all low-income workers have lost jobs or suffered reduced wages
- Most workers & small businesses have less than 3 months in reserve

## What Does Successful Recovery Look Like?

- > Pivoting from Recovery to Renewal
- > Frame our intentions *not* on "how do we get back the region we had" *rather* to "creating the region we want"
- Shifting from reaction to innovation, regionally & by each business
  - > Re-engineering and resilient supply chains
  - New models of customer engagement & service
  - > New dependence on automation, social media, e-commerce
  - Creativity in designing interactions that preserve or re-establish the personal experience

## What Does Successful Recovery Look Like? (cont'd)

#### > Proactive attention to land use & public policy

- ✓ Transportation behavior changes, decentralization
- ✓ Broadband infrastructure, fiber to the home
- ✓ Strategic re-thinking of our relationship to the built environment
- ✓ Opportunity to invest in a variety of sustainable energy resources to accelerate economic recovery

#### ✓ Progressive policy attention to social equity, upward mobility

- Pressure for better protection & pay for front line workers, particularly in groceries, food service, education & health care
- ✓ Investing in re-training especially for low-income workers in occupations that are being eliminated
