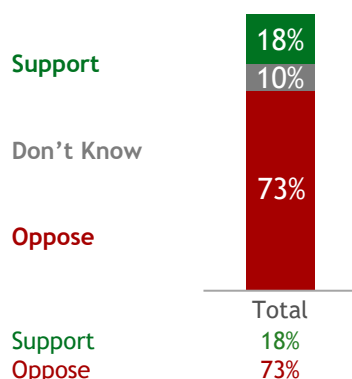

Methodology

On behalf of Caesar Rodney Institute, Ragnar Research conducted a survey of 300 Likely Voters (LVs) across Delaware Statewide. Interviews were conducted February 7 through February 9, 2023 by live telephone operators, including landlines (2%) and cell phones (98%). Quotas on age, gender, ethnicity, education, and region were used to ensure a representative distribution. The study's margin of error is $\pm 6\%$.

Gasoline Vehicle Ban

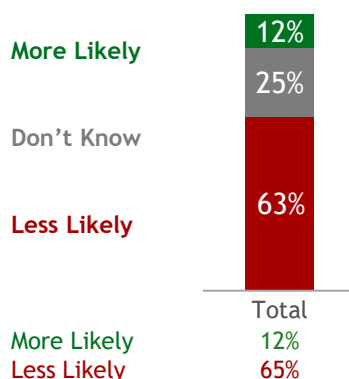

A majority of voters oppose (73%) a ban on the sale of new cars that are powered by gasoline and that would only allow sale of new electric cars, especially Republican voters (82%). High costs, not having a sufficient number of charging stations, and environmental harm from batteries are the main concerns. Voters are less likely to re-elect a legislator who supports the gasoline vehicle ban.

Question Text

Vehicle Bans: Some say we should ban the sale of new cars and trucks in Delaware that are powered by gasoline or diesel and only allow the sale of new electric cars. Do you support or oppose a ban on the sale of new cars and trucks that are powered by gasoline or diesel?

Re-elect Legislator: Would you be more likely or less likely to re-elect a legislator who voted for the gasoline vehicle ban?

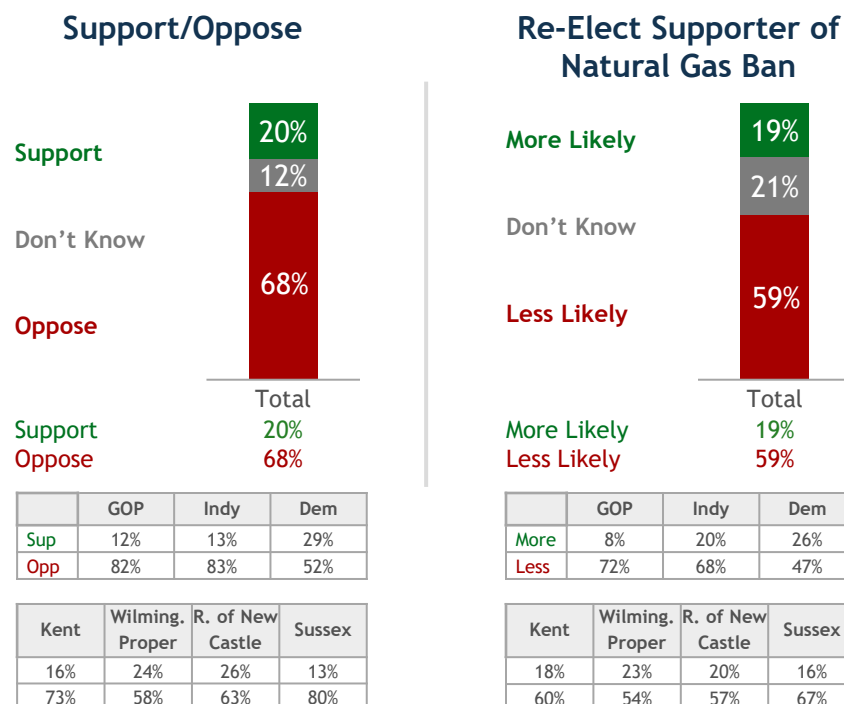

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Natural Gas & Propane Ban



68% of voters in Delaware oppose requiring all new buildings to use only electric for cooking and heating. They don't believe electric is efficient enough and cost would be an issue. A majority of voters would be less likely to re-elect a legislator who supports the natural gas and propane ban.

Question Text

Natural Gas Ban: *Some say we should require all new buildings in Delaware to use only electric for cooking and heating. Natural gas, propane, and fuel oil would not be permitted. Do you support or oppose requiring all new buildings in Delaware to use only electric for cooking and heating?*

Re-elect Legislator: *Would you be more likely or less likely to re-elect a legislator who voted for the natural gas and propane ban?*

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
