While much of society observes Halloween, Lutherans direct their attention to the events of 1517 when Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. It began the Reformation, wherein Luther sought to call the medieval church back to the teachings of the Bible.

We are very familiar with the primary truths espoused by Luther and his adherents: *Sola Fide* (faith alone), *Sola Gratia* (grace alone), *Sola Scriptura* (Scripture alone) and *Sola Christus* (Christ alone). As a confessional church body, The Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod steadfastly clings to these truths. When there is any discussion of how salva-

tion is obtained, the answer is simple: by grace through faith in Jesus Christ alone as revealed to us in the Bible.

The apostle Paul stated it simply as he wrote to the Ephesians:

And you were dead in the trespasses and sins in which you once walked. ... But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus ... so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Eph. 2:1ff

What a magnificent gifting to us by our Heavenly Father — salvation in Christ by grace through faith — a free gift from God's heart of love just by trusting His Word!

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." **Matt. 28:19-20**

The Holy Spirit has made us the "goers" and the "makers" and the "baptizers" and the "teachers" to those among us! Paul defined how Christ's salvation impacts who we are:

For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

Eph. 2:10
